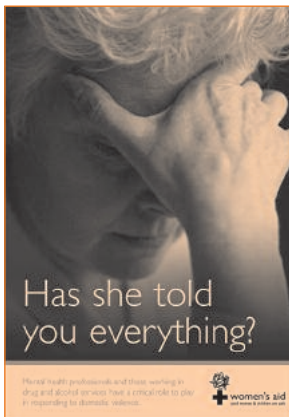

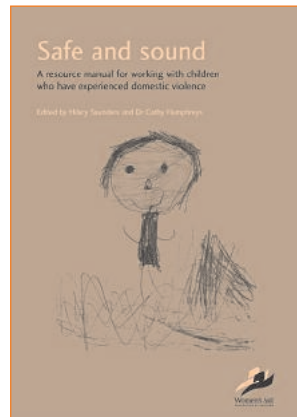
## Safe and sound
