SOS save our services

Specialist women's domestic abuse services save lives, and during the pandemic have been needed more than ever.

Yet their future is under threat.

Commit to our four-point pledge if elected as Police and Crime Commissioner:

- **Prioritise tackling domestic abuse and violence against women and girls.** Work with survivors and specialist women's services to create a robust local strategy that tackles the root causes of sexism and inequality driving male violence against women.
- **Sustainably fund and commission women's services, and services led by and for Black and minoritised women,** in future domestic abuse funding and commissioning processes. Reject 'gender-neutral' and 'one-size fits all' approaches within funding and commissioning which harm women and the women-only services they need.
- **Deliver grant funding wherever possible in domestic abuse commissioning processes.** Competitive tendering fails to recognise the enormous value of women's services, who are experts in supporting survivors. When procurement is required, ensure it meaningfully involves specialist women's services and values their quality and expertise.
- **Once elected, visit your local specialist women's domestic abuse services, including local services led 'by and for' Black and minoritised women, to see their life-saving work.** Commit to working in partnership with them to ensure no survivor is turned away from the support they need.
